Auf Wiedersehen

The first time I moved was between kindergarten and the first grade. We went into a bigger house, but it was only across an alley and a few streets away from the other place. We could nearly see the old house from the new house; and we were still in the same neighborhood with all our friends.

In the middle of the tenth grade, my parents moved us twenty miles away to be closer to Dad's workplace. Before the internet, free long-distance, and all the technology we have today, that was a big deal. It was especially hard on my older brother and me, because we were completely dug in and involved in high school activities. That was my first big good-bye.

Since that time, I have moved because my military spouse had orders to do so, then I decided to go to seminary, and finally because the churches I was called to serve were in other places. Over my adult lifetime, I have said good-bye to a lot of people. No matter the reason, or how many times, it's still hard to do.

There are many ways we say goodbye to each other in every language. One of the best ones, I think, is the German auf wiedersehen. It's formal, in the way we might say "goodbye" instead of just "bye." But the literal translation is "upon again seeing." Though it's a formal phrase for departure, the message is more like our informal "see you later." It's not a permanent farewell. It is "until I see you again."

As I depart this place, my faith in eternal life assures me that we will see each other again. In this life or God's heavenly place, it will be good to reunite. It has been an absolute joy getting to know so many of you, working along side you, and having the honor to serve as your pastor for this short time. I continue to be inspired and impressed by the ministry that takes place inside these walls and outside in the world. Thank you for all you do and for letting me be part of it.
