ALTERNATIVE GIFT-GIVING: Today's AGG Spotlight is on Second Harvest Food

Bank. In spite of mounting challenges, the Second Harvest Food Bank continues to distribute food to the needy in the tri-county area. Recent years have been particularly difficult: inflation continues; gas prices are unstable; the number of residents needing assistance, especially children and seniors, is always increasing. Due to these problems, Second Harvest has had to spend 200% more on food to fill its shelves. As you are enjoying your Thanksgiving feast, think of these numbers: Second Harvest distributed 10.5 million pounds of food, filled 16,000+ requests for food assistance per week, and provided eight million meals in their designated area. Of those served, 29% were children; 25% were senior citizens, and 28% were new visitors. Because of inflation, they can now only distribute up to five meals for every \$1 donated. FPC is the beneficiary of this mission. Our own Joann Rubrake, the liaison between the Church and Second Harvest, makes monthly visits to the distribution center to pick up goods for the grocery giveaway held during our community lunch program. The need is real!

Other participating organizations include Animal Welfare League, FPC Wish List – Sound System, Free Indeed Ministry, FreeThree, and Water for the People. Remember to make out your check to First Presbyterian Church (put AGG on the memo line) and to include your order blank with the name(s) of your designated charity(ies). You can drop your donation into the offering plate or mail it to the FPC office. Alternative Gift-Giving will continue through Dec. 16.
